HOW THE POLL WAS CONDUCTED

This poll was conducted for Noticiero Telemundo Arizona by Mason-Dixon Polling & Strategy, Inc. of Jacksonville, Florida from March 4 through March 6, 2020. A total of 625 registered Hispanic voters statewide were interviewed live by telephone in Arizona. All indicated they were likely to vote in the 2020 election.

Those interviewed were randomly selected from a phone-matched Arizona voter registration list that included both land-line and cell phone numbers. Quotas were assigned to reflect Hispanic voter registration by county.

The margin for error, according to standards customarily used by statisticians, is no more than ± 4 percentage points. This means that there is a 95 percent probability that the "true" figure would fall within that range if all Hispanic voters in Arizona were surveyed. The margin for error is higher for any subgroup, such as a gender or age grouping.

The survey also includes an over-sampling of 400 Hispanic Democrats who indicated they were likely to vote in the March 17 Arizona Democratic Primary. These voters were only asked questions relative to the primary and not those focused on statewide issues and the general election. The margin for error for those results is \pm 5 percentage points.
